

VEHICLE CHECKLIST

1. Vehicle Maintenance (Do This Now)

- **Check All Fluids** (Critical in Florida heat):
 - Engine oil
 - Coolant / Antifreeze
 - Brake fluid
 - Transmission fluid (Check in your vehicle when is recommended to change)
 - Power steering fluid
 - Windshield washer fluid
- Full tank of gas (keep above ½ tank at all times during hurricane season)
- Tires properly inflated + spare tire in good condition (including spare's air pressure)
- Battery tested and clean
- Brakes, wipers, and all lights working properly
- Air conditioning working (very important in Florida)
- Registration, insurance, and proof of insurance current and in glovebox + Update Phone Apps + Download offline maps in Google Maps

2. Emergency Kit (Keep in Vehicle Year-Round)

- Jumper cables Or NOCO Starter
- Flashlight + extra batteries (or hand-crank)
- First aid kit (including trauma supplies)
- Bottled water (minimum 4–6 gallons)
- Non-perishable snacks / protein bars (3–5 day supply)
- Blanket or emergency sleeping bag
- Rain poncho + change of clothes
- Tool kit (screwdrivers, pliers, knife, duct tape, zip ties)
- Fire extinguisher
- Tire pressure gauge + 12V air compressor or fix-a-flat
- Road flares or reflective triangles
- Tow strap

3. Grid-Down & Evacuation Gear

- Printed maps + laminated evacuation routes (QGIS or Google Maps)
- Portable phone charger + solar charger
- GMRS / FRS handheld radio (with extra batteries)
- Cash in small bills (\$200–\$500)
- Full PACE Communications Plan card
- Bug-Out Bag (72-hour minimum) in trunk
- N95 masks + safety glasses (smoke / debris) + working gloves (PPE)
- Portable jump starter / power bank

4. 72–24 Hours Before Storm (Final Actions)

- **Re-check All Fluids** and top off as needed
- Fill gas tank completely
- Move vehicle to highest ground possible (or garage)
- Load evacuation supplies (cooler, clothes, documents)
- Test all lights, wipers, AC, and radio
- Clean out unnecessary items
- Install phone mount + offline maps loaded

5. Evacuation Quick Tips

- Leave **early** (48–72 hours before landfall recommended)
- Primary: **Gainesville** (~130 miles)
- Alternate: **Ocala** (~105 miles)
- Long-range: **Atlanta** (~457 miles)
